Alder Valley Brass is bidding to bag a massive cash boost from the Tesco Bags of Help initiative.

Tesco teamed up with Groundwork to launch its community funding scheme, which sees grants of £4,000, £2,000 and £1,000 raised from carrier bag sales in Tesco stores awarded to local community projects.

Three groups in every Tesco region have been shortlisted to receive the cash award and shoppers are being invited to head along to Tesco stores to vote for who they think should take away the top grant.

We are delighted that Alder Valley Brass is one of the groups on the shortlist.

We are much in need of a new uniform, and we would love to get enough money in order to be able to afford to do this. Band jackets are expensive items, and we need jackets for the full band.

For more than 50 years Alder Valley Brass has performed at venues ranging from London's Royal Albert Hall, Windsor Castle and Hampton Court Palace, to many of the UK's famous parks, bandstands and National Trust properties. Much of the band's concert work is in support of local charities and there have been proud moments working with Help for Heroes and the Royal British Legion, charities selected by the Mayor of Rushmoor at concerts, as well as The SSAFA and Phyllis Tuckwell Hospice. Alder Valley Brass is a registered charity (Number 1155512) and relies on public donations.

Voting is open in Tesco stores from Thursday 1st March to Monday 30th April 2018. The locations which you will be able to vote for Alder Valley Brass will be in Aldershot, Ash Vale, Farnborough, Fleet and Farnham. Customers will cast their vote using a token given to them at the check-out in store each time they shop. Please support us if you live in this area.

Tesco's Bags of Help project has already delivered over £43 million to more than 10,000 projects up and down the UK. Tesco customers get the chance to vote for three different groups every time they shop. Every other month, when votes are collected, three groups in each of Tesco's regions will be awarded funding.
